Kindness Ambassadors

This week, our Kindness Ambassadors have continued their training to become peer mentors. Within this role, they will be supporting their peers (within their classes and in other classes) when they need help. They will be available on the playground everyday. Their training is comprehensive and includes:

- Learning how to listen to other children when they present them with a problem.
- How to address the problem - understanding if they need adult support with it, or if it is something that they can resolve.
- Learning how to find solutions to problems by working together.
- Knowing when to ask for help - whether that be from another kindness ambassador, or an adult.

In the future, their role will involve supporting children who have posted a worry inside the classroom worry boxes.

Looking Ahead

End of year reports will be sent home on Monday 10th July. On Tuesday 11th, you will be invited into school for an open evening. This will not follow a formal parents evening procedure, but be more of an informal opportunity to look at your child's books with them in the classroom, discuss anything you would like with your child's current teacher, meet your child's teacher for September and have a look at the classroom your child will be in in September 2023.
