Welcome Back



Reception are enjoying lots of lovely picture books!

In Year 1, we are reading *Toys in Space* by Mini Grey. In this book, toys get sucked up because they got left outside. We are also reading *Meet the Planets* by Caryl Hart. It is a journey to space. - Joshua and Lettie

In Year 2, we are reading *The Hedgehog* by Dick King-Smith. It is about Max the hedgehog who is trying to cross the road without getting hurt! - Della and Ernie

Year 3 are reading *The Wild Robot* by Peter Brown. At the start of this amazing story, a robot gets stranded on an island. Will he survive? - Jessie and Jamie
